

GEORGIA PROMISE

SCHOLARSHIP

Georgia Promise Scholarships are education savings accounts worth up to \$6,500 per student, per school year. Parents can use these state-administered, state-funded accounts to cover certain education options for their child's needs.

Priority is given to students who have received Promise Scholarships in past years, as well as students whose family income is less than 400% of the federal poverty level (approx. \$120K/year).

HOW CAN THEY BE USED?

Parents can use Promise Scholarships to cover expenses for:

- Online programs or classes.
 - Tutoring services.
 - Curriculum and textbooks.
 - Adaptive or assistive technologies for students with special needs.
 - Educational therapies.
 - Transportation costs.
 - Tuition and fees for participating private schools, vocational programs, or colleges.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

The following requirements must be met for a family to be eligible for a Promise Scholarship:

- Parents must be official Georgia residents for at least one year. Exemption for active-duty military families.
- Student must have been enrolled in an eligible school for at least two consecutive semesters or be entering kindergarten.
- Once eligible, a child remains eligible through 12th grade, even if the legislature allows the program to expire.
- The student may not use Promise Scholarships for in-district public school or charter schools since those costs are covered through state education funding.
- Families agree to use Promise Scholarships only for qualifying education expenses.
- The student must live in the attendance zone of a school ranked in the bottom 25% of Georgia public schools. For a list of eligible schools, parents can visit: <https://foropportunity.org/ga-promise-scholarship-eligible-school-list/> or scan this code:



HOW TO APPLY:

Applications open four times a year, and families can apply during any application cycle.

The remaining 2025 application periods are:

- June 1 – June 30, 2025
- September 1 – September 30, 2025
- December 1, 2025 – January 31, 2026

The personal documentation required for applications include:

- Driver's license or government-issued ID
- Proof of Georgia residency (utility bill, mortgage statement, bill of house sale, lease agreement)
- Most recent federal 1040 form
